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Director's Notes

Many people know Puccini's 1926 opera, *Turandot*, but few are familiar with Carlo Gozzi's play by the same title, written in 1762, from which the composer took his libretto. We in the University of Victoria's Department of Theatre are delighted to have had the chance to tackle this rarely seen play and we hope you will share in the enjoyment we have found in exploring the rich, theatrical world of 18th Century Italy. Gozzi referred to all his plays as "fairy tales" and it is by no means difficult to see how *Turandot* went on to make the leap into Grand Opera.

This is excellent territory for drama students to explore as it demands truth and precision in the performance of a story that is not told in psychological intimacy but rather in large, sweeping strokes. While few of us today would espouse Gozzi's social philosophy, which encouraged the subjugation of women to the superior qualities of men, and discouraged the rise of the unwashed masses when the inherent virtues of the blue-bloods were sufficient to make us all happy, we definitely do admire his mix of styles and his astonishing verve. Such is the stuff of fairy tales, which have a special kind of power. As it turns out, of course, neither women nor the common folk could be held back and Gozzi himself was largely relegated to the dusty shelves of dramatic history, until the 20th Century theatre sought to free itself from the chains of psychological realism. Puccini wasn't the only one to revive Gozzi's work: Prokofiev, Brecht, even Julie Taymor of *Lion King* fame have all made good use of his plays and professional productions of his plays appear regularly on stages in Europe.

We hope you will enjoy this discovery no less than we have. **Buon spectacolo**.



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John Van Burek Guest Director



Toronto native, John Van Burek, has worked in theatre as a director, teacher and translator for thirty years. In 1971 he founded Théâtre français de Toronto and since then, has played an integral part in the evolution of Canadian theatre, in English and French. He has taught at the National Theatre School/École Nationale de Théâtre, Nottingham Theatre School (U.K.), Ryerson Theatre School and York University. He has translated the plays of Michel Tremblay, in addition to three plays by the great 18th Century playwright, Marivaux, which he

has produced through his own company The Pleiades Theatre. He recently completed a new version of Beaumarchais' *The Marriage of Figaro*, to be included in an upcoming anthology of world theatre, edited by Professor Jennifer Wise of The Department of Theatre, UVic.

Ritirong Jiwakanon Set and Costume Designer



Ritirong Jiwakanon is delighted to be designing in Canada for the first time. He received his M.F.A. in theatre design from Yale School of Drama and spent several years after school professionally designing for theatre in NYC. His design credit includes *Peer Gynt, Macbeth, The Winter's Tale, Twelfth Night* at Yale Repertory Theatre and Yale University Theatre; in NYC *Knoxville 1915* at Chelsea Repertory Company, *Lemuel* at La Mama Theatre, *Lucia de Lammermoor* at Pace Downtown Theatre, *Hazy Crazy Lazy Play* at Vineyard Theatre. He also

was the cultural consultant for the 1996 Broadway production of *The King and I* and in 1994 he was an artist member of the project of The Green Neighborhoods Program of Park Council, NYC. Later he decided to move back to Thailand and started working for theatre as a designer and academic scholar in Southeast Asian Performing Arts. Design credits include; in Bangkok, *Sylvia, Arts, Rashomon, Waiting For Godot, A Midsummer Night's Dream, The Way of The World, Lost in Yonkers, Black Comedy, Amahl and The Night Visitor,* and *Pink Elephant* (the Butoh Dance Performance) and *Mixed Signals* at Victory Theatre in Singapore. In 1998 he was a costume designer for *Sound and Light Extravaganza - The Golden Heritage of The Rattanakosin Era*, to celebrate The 72nd Royal Birthday Anniversary of His Majesty the King of Thailand. Ritirong is a Professor of Design at The Department of Dramatic Arts, Chulalongkorn University, Bangkok, Thailand.

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Carlo Gozzi *Playwright* 1720 - 1806

One of Venice's leading 18th Century playwrights, Carlo Gozzi frequently wrote satiric fairy tales for *comedia* troupes. He emphasized fantasy, magic and spectacular effects. Gozzi worked hard at trying to preserve the dying tradition of *commedia dell'arte* in Italy. This style of improvised comedy - as opposed to scripted plays, which were becoming standard all over Europe, was truly indigenous to Italy. Admired in Italy and elsewhere in Europe, Gozzi's dramas have become the basis of subsequent theatrical works; *Turandot* is the play that inspired Puccini's opera, *Turandot*. *The Beautiful Little Green Bird* became *The Green Bird*, Julie Taymor's recent Broadway reinterpretation of his fable. Gozzi's *Fiaba dell'amore delle tre melarance* was set to music by Prokofiev as *The Love for Three Oranges*. And, *La Donna Serpente*, which was first produced in Venice in 1762 - two hundred and thirty- eight years later, *The Serpent Woman* found itself being performed in Manhattan this past Spring.

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
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Paul Mathiesen Lighting Designer
