
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Director's Notes

Something gnawed at me as I and my collaborators started the creative process you are about to witness in tonight's production of Henrik Ibsen's 19th century poetic masterpiece *Peer Gynt*.

How would Ibsen - who would later become famous as both a great champion of women's rights and as the master architect of naturalism - have created a work so seemingly misogynistic and disunified? True, *Peer* is the product of a younger imagination than that which gave the world such tightly constructed, sympathetic portraits of women as *A Doll's House* and *Hedda Gabler*. This fact alone, however, does not explain the aesthetic and philosophical chasm that separates *Peer* from Ibsen's later plays.

As I write these notes we are in mid-rehearsal and still formulating our response to the stylistic sprawl of the play. Our instinct has been to reject the aesthetic bias that great art needs to be guided by the concept of unity of form. The strength we see in the play is that it was so far-sighted in its anticipation of many of the major dramatic forms of 20th century theatre art. Our search has been to find a balance point that can allow such diverse genres as naturalism, expressionism and absurdism to exist simultaneously. The spirit of this search has been informed by our belief that 19th - century Europe was aflame with discovery and was less concerned than we are with how an idea is packaged.

And our response to the issue of how women are portrayed in the script has been to remember that above all, Ibsen intended *Peer Gynt* to be a satire. The specific targets of this satire may have dimmed with time. What remains clear, however, is that, in constructing an epic story about a single male's life-long struggle with the sources of his own fear and foolishness, Ibsen created for his time a portrait comparable in greatness to Cervantes' *Don Quixote* or Molière's *Misanthrope*.

Problematic to understand and accomplish on the stage? Yes. But what a magnificent problem.

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Brian Richmond Director

Newly appointed Chair of the Department of Theatre at UVic, Brian was born and raised in Vancouver and trained at Vancouver's Holiday Theatre and Ecole Lecoq in Paris. He obtained his MA in drama from the University of Toronto. He has taught and/or created productions for many leading Canadian universities including McGill, Concordia, Simon Fraser, York, Waterloo and Toronto, as well as the National Theatre School of Canada. Last season he was the Guest Director of the Phoenix production of *Frogs*.

As a professional director, Brian has created numerous productions for several leading theatres throughout Canada and the U.S. He was founding Artistic Director of Saskatoon's Persephone Theatre and served as AD for Montreal's Playwrights Workshop, Thunder Bay's Magnus Theatre and Toronto's Theatre Passe Muraille. A four-time nominee for Outstanding Direction in the Dora Mavor Moore Awards, Brian won this award for his 1988 production of *Fire*. This production (as well as his 1991 *Lilies*) was also chosen as Outstanding Production.

President of the Toronto Theatre Alliance from 1988 – 1991, Brian has also served on a number of juries for the Canada and Ontario Arts Councils as well as receiving a number of their highest grants and awards.

Allan Stichbury Set Designer



Allan Stichbury has designed for theatres all across Canada including Stratford and Shaw. For Opera he has designed at the Edmonton, Calgary and Manitoba Operas and The Banff Centre. He has also designed on Broadway, lighting for *Mr. Lincoln* at the Morosco Theatre. Allan has taught at the University of Victoria since 1988. Most recent designs include sets and lighting for The Shaw Festival's *The Mystery of Edwin Drood, Three Tall Women* at the Manitoba Theatre Center, and *A Christmas Carol* for Theatre New Brunswick. He is currently designing set and costumes for Alberta Theatre

Project's *The Beauty Queen of Leenane*. For the Phoenix, recent designs were for *Endgame, The Seagull* and *Frogs*. He exhibited at the 1995 and 1999 Prague Quadrennial. Allan is past president of Associated Designers of Canada.

Mary Kerr Costume Designer



Mary Kerr has designed sets and costumes for the Shaw, Stratford, and Banff festivals and most major Canadian regional Theatres. Her Opera and ballet design includes work with such companies as the Canadian Opera Company and the Paris Opera and National Ballet of Canada. In 1994 Mary Kerr was production designer for the Opening and Closing Ceremonies of the Commonwealth Games in Victoria. Professional acknowledgements include seven Dora Mavor Moores and three Sterling Awards. Ms. Kerr has represented Canada at the Prague Quadrennial Design Competition. A commissioned

Bravo fact Film: *Mary Kerr: The Creative Process* has just been released and shown at the Museum of Modern Art in NYC. *The Toy Castle*, for which Mary is the set and costume designer is going into its third season of filming and was nominated for a Gemini award for best production design. Mary is a Professor of Design in the UVic Theatre Department.

Robert Thomson Lighting Designer



Robert Thomson is one of Canada's most versatile and active lighting designers. His work for theatre, opera and dance has won him four Dora Mavor Moore awards. He served as Resident Lighting Designer for The National Ballet of Canada for twelve seasons. His numerous company designs include **Swan Lake**, **Romeo and Juliet** and **Washington Square**. The 2002 season will mark Robert's twenty-fourth season designing for Shaw Festival. Highlights of his Shaw credits include a tenyear term as Head of Lighting Design, **Picnic**, **Six Characters In Search Of An Author**, **St. Joan**, **Cavalcade**, and **Cyrano de**

Bergerac. His recent credits include Present Laughter for Citadel Theatre and N.A.C., the Canadian Opera Company's globally acclaimed Bluebeard's Castle and Erwartung directed by Robert Lepage, Nabucco for Pacific Opera, Anne of Green Gables and Emily for the Charlottetown Festival, Desir for Stuttgart Ballet and The Taming of the Shrew for ABT at the Metropolitan Opera. He is currently consulting on the creation of the Stratford Festival's new Studio Theatre and will design High-Gravel-Blind, Eternal Hydra, The Swanne and King Lear on the Festival Stage. Mr. Thomson is a member of the Associated Designers of Canada.

John Mills-Cockell Composer/Sound Designer




John Mills-Cockell designed the sound for All's Well That Ends Well, Coronation Voyage, An Ideal Husband and Hard Times for the National Arts Centre. He has created over 100 scores for film, television and radio and has a discography of 10 recordings. Recent credits include Atlantis, Skylight and Mrs. Warren's Profession for The Vancouver Playhouse, Running Dog and Paper Tiger for The Gateway Theatre as well as The Planet Earth and King Lear produced by John Juliani for CBC Radio. His credits also include work for the Royal Winnipeg Ballet and the National Ballet of Canada. Mr. Mills-Cockell won

the SOCAN award for outstanding contribution to Canadian film and the Canadian Film and Television Award for best original score for *The Newcomers*. He has a commission from the Glasgow Gallery of Modern Art for *Music for Heaven* and is currently working on a feature film about labour activist Ginger Goodwin.



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RYAN ARNOLD

Peer Gynt is Ryan's fifth and final main stage at the Phoenix Theatres. He will be graduating in April from the acting program. Memorable roles for Ryan include Clov in **Endgame** and Oxford in **Two Planks and a Passion**. In addition Ryan has been seen in many SATCo and MFA productions over the past four seasons.

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
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MELISSA HALSTROM
