Director's Notes



I came home from my first evening rehearsal for tonight's play to a sad sight. My wife's and my oldest cat Spook had finally given in to months of defying the odds against death caused by what our vets had called a heart three times the size that it should be. What "hot ice and wondrous strange snow," to quote our most famous English speaking playwright – to be starting to work on this wonderful paean to the love of animals and nature that has so thrilled readers and audiences since Kenneth Grahame first began to tell

his son these stories over a century ago, yet, to lose a creature who had for many years touched our lives with his friendship on the same day. But this, of course, is much of the point of Mr. Grahame's original stories and Mr. Bennett's wonderful stage adaptation of his work. We never truly lose anything that touches us. It is mine and the wonderfully talented cast and creative team's hope that this production will touch you in the same way that the original 1991 production at the National Theatre of Great Britain touched me and thousands of other theatre audience members who saw it. In this way animals and plays are the same. They come, they go – but the emotional impact they have on our lives is the length of memory.

This one's for you Spook.

About the Playwright



Alan Bennett first appeared on the stage in 1960 as one of the authors and performers of the revue *Beyond the Fringe*. His stage plays include *Forty Years On*, *Getting On*, *Habeas Corpus*, *The Old Country*, *Enjoy* and *Kafka's Dick*, and he has written many television plays, notably *A Day Out*, *Sunset Across the Bay*, *A Woman of No Importance* and the series of monologues *Talking Heads*. An adaptation of his television play *An Englishman Abroad* was paired with *A Question of Attribution* in the double bill *Single Spies*, first produced by the National Theatre in 1998. This was followed in 1990 by

his adaptation of *The Wind in the Willows* and in 1991 by *The Madness of King George III*, both produced by the National Theatre. His stage version of *The Lady in the Van* was first seen in the West End in 1999. His most recent play, *The History Boys*, premiered at the National Theatre in 2004 and won the *Evening Standard* and Critic's Circle awards for Best Play, the Laurence Olivier Award for Best New Play and the South Bank Award.

Creative Team



Brian Richmond Director

Chair of the Department of Theatre at UVic, Brian has directed over one hundred productions for leading theatres and universities throughout Canada, the US and Mexico. His productions of *Fire* and *Lilies* won Toronto's Dora Mavor Moore Awards for Outstanding Production and his 2004 Belfry production of *Proof* won the Victoria Spotlight Award as Best Production. He is also a winner and fourtime nominee for Outstanding Director in the Dora Awards. He was founding Artistic Director of Saskatoon's Persephone Theatre and

served as Artistic Director for Montreal's Playwrights Workshop, Thunder Bay's Magnus Theatre and Toronto's Theatre Passe Muraille. Brian's most recent professional directing credits include *Lagrimas Crueles* at the Teatro Salvador Novo del Centro Nacional de las Artes in Mexico City, *Honour* for the Belfry Theatre and Winnipeg's Prairie Theatre Exchange and *Old Times* for the Neptune Theatre in Halifax. For the Phoenix, Brian has directed *Frogs*, *Peer Gynt, The Resistible Rise of Arturo Ui, He Who Gets Slapped, The Fever, Guys and Dolls* and *Tyrants*. Brian was recently received the Alumni Award from Burnaby South Secondary School.



Mary Kerr Production Designer

Mary is a Professor of Design at the University of Victoria and has designed sets and costumes for theatre, dance, opera, film and television, nationally and internationally, at the Paris Opera, the Canadian Opera, the National Ballet of Canada, the Stratford and Shaw festivals, the Opening and Closing Ceremonies of the Commonwealth Games and the PBS series, *The Toy Castle*. A finalist representing Canada at World Stage 2005 and the Prague Quadrennial Design Competition in 1983 and 2003, she has also won seven Dora Mavor

Moore Awards and three Sterling Awards. Most recently Mary was a juror for the Siminovitch Design Award 2006 and designed the production of *Copper Thunderbird* at the National Arts Centre May 2007. She is a member of the Royal College of Art, Directors Guild of Canada and Associate Designers of Canada. Recent Phoenix productions include costumes for *Richard III, Tyrants, The Irresistible Rise of Arturo Ui* and *Peer Gynt* and both sets and costumes for *He Who Gets Slapped*.



Steven Hawkins Lighting Designer

Steven's extensive credits include The Merchant of Venice, Henry IV Part I, As You Like It, Love's Labour's Lost and Death of a Salesman for the Stratford Festival. Other credits include The Real Thing and Hosanna (MTC); The Caretaker, The Winter's Tale and A Chorus of Disapproval (Soulpepper Theatre); Cabaret (Grand Theatre/MTC); Ain't Misbehavin' and Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf? (Grand Theatre); Whale (Young Peoples Theatre); Amadeus and Summer and Smoke (Theatre Calgary); La Maison Suspendue and Tartuffe (CanStage); and Fences (NAC). His

work has also been seen at the Shaw Festival, the Tarragon, the Grand Opera House in Belfast and the Old Vic in London.



John Mills-Cockell Composer and Musical Director

John has created over 100 scores for film, TV and radio and has a discography of 10 recordings. Credits include scores for King Lear produced by John Juliani for CBC Radio and the CBC TV series 49th & Main as well as productions for Canadian Stage, National Arts Centre, Vancouver Playhouse, The Royal Winnipeg Ballet, and The National Ballet of Canada. For the Phoenix he has designed sound for The Taming of the Shrew, He Who Gets Slapped, Peer Gynt and Tyrants. John won the SOCAN Award for outstanding contribution to Canadian

Film and the Canadian Film & Television Award for best original score for *The Newcomers*. This year he is recipient of a Canada Council grant for the composition of his music/theatre piece *Savitri & Sam*.



Creative Team



Treena Stubel Choreographer

Treena Stubel has appeared as a dancer and actor with a variety of companies including: Suddenly Dance Theatre, Theatre SKAM, Dancetheatre David Earle, Constance Cooke, Atomic Vaudeville and Intrepid Theatre. As a creator, she has presented original works in Canada and Europe for The Hay Festival, fringe festivals, Dancing on the Edge, and ROMP! A Festival of Independent Dance, and has worked in residency at the Tyrone Guthrie Centre in Monaghan Ireland. She holds a BFA in Theatre from the University of Victoria and an MFA

in Lecoq Physical Theatre from LISPA in London UK.



Kate Costin Stage Manager

Kate is in her final year at the Phoenix studying both stage management and costume design. In the department Kate has worked on *Street of Crocodiles* (Stage Manager), *Richard III* (Assistant Costume Designer), *Tyrants* (Assistant Stage Manager), *Crackpot* (dresser), and *Guys and Dolls* (crew). Ewan McLaren Assistant Director

Ewan McLaren is a Canadian director and producer who has worked predominantly in Prague, Czech Republic. He has directed contemporary works by UK, US and Canadian playwrights for Czech repertory companies, including plays by Christopher Hampton, Stephen Poliakoff, George F. Walker, Sam Shephard, and most recently, Caryl Churchill's *A Number* for the Vinohrady Theatre. As producer he has worked for da da kamera in Toronto, One Yellow Rabbit in Calgary, and the Alfred in Courtyard Theatre, Prague. Here at the Phoenix he

directed last year's *The Street of Crocodiles*, based on the short stories of Polish author Bruno Schulz, and will direct the premiere of Montreal playwright Pan Bouyoucas' *Lionel* here in February.



Ned Vukovic Dialect Consultant

Before joining UVic's Theatre faculty Ned was one of Toronto's most in-demand coaches and acting teachers. As an actor he is a former member of both the Royal Shakespeare Company and Royal National Theatres. He was artistic director of Solar Stage Theatre in Toronto for three years and producer/director with his own company Lovers and Madmen with which he created numerous projects including the Dora Mavor Moore Award winning *Molly Wood* at Toronto's Bathurst St. Theatre. He has appeared in over 75 films and is one of Canada's

leading dialect coaches teaching various dialects to hundreds of actors including seven Academy Award winners. Ned was the dialect coach for *Guys and Dolls* and *Fen* and directed *Accidental Death of an Anarchist*.



Sabrina Miller Assistant Set Design

Sabrina is in her final year at the Phoenix Theatre where she has majored in set and costume design. Previous designs at the Phoenix include costumes for *Crackpot* and *Tartuffe*. She has worked with many companies in town as a designer including Kaleidoscope, Victoria Shakespeare Society, Oak Bay Beach Hotel, Victoria Operatic Society and Four Seasons. Sabrina's next adventure is designing costumes for Kaleidoscope's *Aladdin* in December.

Ingrid Hansen Miss Pettifrock, Rabbit Rose, Pan's Voice, Fox, Alto sax, piano

Ingrid's Phoenix credits include Street of Crocodiles, Top Girls, Metamorphoses and That Elusive Spark. She has also performed with Kokoro Dance, Out-of-the-Box Productions, Atomic Vaudeville, Discovery Dance, and Viva Musica. She designed costumes for ITZAZOO's Grimm Tales and SATCO's Sex Lives of Vegetables. In 2006 Ingrid founded SNAFU Dance Theatre, whose production BLINK won best physical/dance production at Victoria Fringe Festival 2007.

Marina Lagacé Hedgehog Tommy, Pan's Voice, Mouse Martha

Marina is in her third year at the Phoenix. She has been involved with many SATCo productions including Parens and the recent *The Sex Lives of Vegetables*. Marina played many roles in ITSAZOO's *Grimm Tales* in Mt. Doug Park this summer. *Wind in the Willows* is her first mainstage.

Kayla Elianna Lehman Pan's Voice, Motorist Monica

This is Kayla's mainstage debut and second year at the Department of Theatre. Last year she was a dresser for the Phoenix's *Richard III*. Her favorite roles include Paulinka in *A Bright Room Called Day* and Young Sophie in *Sophie* at the Tacoma School of the Arts.



Taylor Lewis Squirrel Raymond, Portly Otter

This is Taylor's second mainstage, having appeared in last fall's production of *Richard III*. Carey is a fourth year acting student at UVic. This marks his third performance in a main stage with Richard III and *Tyrants* being his others. He has performed at the Belfry Studio and with Victoria's Atomic Vaudeville. Carey toured the Fringe circuit this summer and tore the roof off of the Victoria Fringe festival with his show, *Chip Pop: A Musical Sexploitation*.


