



Chari Arespacochaga Director

Chari Arespacochaga's theatre directing credits include Honk, Footloose The Musical, High School Musical, Doubt, Altar Boyz, Spring Awakening, Legally Blonde, Disney's Aida, Disney's The Little Mermaid, Avenue Q (Manila and Singapore), Disney's Aladdin, The Full Monty, Disney's Tarzan and Rock of Ages. She created the musical staging for Manila and Singapore productions of The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee, Next to Normal, and A Little Night Music. She was Associate Director for Broadway Asia's Asian tour of Cinderella and for Venus in Fur at the Belfry Theatre. She is also an actress, teacher and drama coach, and creates musical staging. She has taught, created and devised workshops in creative drama, devising, storytelling and musical theatre for different age groups, levels of experience and corporations. As a director/ teacher, Chari leads some of these classes in the creation of devised/original work. As a writer/director, Chari has been enlisted by the Guardian Princess Alliance, the group behind the new book series called Guardian Princesses to develop scripts and material for performance as theatre for young audiences based on their books. Chari has just finished directing observerships with, and participated in, developmental play readings for theatre companies in New York. She was recently one of the directors for the New York-based Pop Up Theatrics' Long Distance Affair, a series of short plays conceived, designed and staged for a series of Skype performances in Bucharest. Her piece, entitled 9 Minutes was created in collaboration with an actress from New York and a writer from Bolivia.




Allan Stichbury Set Designer

Recent productions at the University of Victoria include set designs for *Lion in the Streets, A Midsummer Night's Dream, Unity: 1918; You're a Good Man, Charlie Brown; Inside; Twelfth Night, and Yerma.* Beyond the university, recent credits include set designs for *The Rake's Progress* and *Flying Dutchman* at Pacific Opera Victoria, *The Barber of Seville* at the Vancouver and Edmonton operas, *One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest* at Theatre Calgary and The Royal Manitoba Theatre Centre, set and lighting design for *Communion* at Alberta Theatre Projects and lighting design for *God of Carnage* at Theatre Calgary. He helped establish the current Student Exchange Agreement between Bangkok University and UVic, and is a past president of Associated Designers of Canada.



Pauline Stynes Costume Designer

After training and a career in tailoring and costuming, Pauline's love of theatre and desire to create beautiful costumes inspired her to return to school for her BFA in Design. She is absolutely honoured to be the costume designer for *Amadeus*, her second mainstage production. Pauline's previous Phoenix credits include designing costumes for last season's *Picnic* and acting as Wardrobe Supervisor for *Eurydice*. She has also worked on several local productions, including *A Christmas Carol, Let Me Call You Sweetheart* (Belfry), *My Fair Lady* (Blue Bridge), and *Smalltown: A Pick Up Musical* (Theatre SKAM). She was also Head of Wardrobe for the world-premiere production of the opera *Marilyn Forever* (Aventa Ensemble) and worked on the costumes for *Equivocation* (Belfry), and *Thoroughly Modern Millie* (VOS).



Michael Whitfield Lighting Designer

In a career spanning almost 40 years, Michael Whitfield has designed the lighting for hundreds of plays, operas and ballets throughout North America and overseas. As resident lighting designer at the Stratford Festival for over 25 years, his lighting included such classics as *The Mikado*, which toured throughout North America and also played at London's Old Vic Theatre. His opera and ballet designs have been featured at companies such as the Canadian Opera Company, San Francisco Opera, San Diego Opera, the National Ballet of Canada and the Finnish National Ballet. Michael has mentored the careers of dozens of young Canadian lighting designers and he has been a frequent guest designer at the University of Victoria.


Brian Linds Sound Designer

This February, a whole roller-coaster car full of alumni returned to Victoria to help raise funds for Blue Bridge Repertory Theatre. Alumni **Rielle Braid (BFA '09), Sarah Jane Pelzer (BFA '09),** and **Kholby Wardell (BFA '08)** joined the rest of the cast of *Ride the Cyclone* to perform *The Cyclone Song Cycle* for five shows. The event was hosted by alumnae **Britt Small (MFA'04)**, Atomic Vaudeville's Co-Artistic Director and *Ride The Cyclone* Co-Director. The play has it's much-anticipated premiere at an American Theatre in Chicago this fall. 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
