Director's Notes



My Grandmother always said, *"Start with gratitude."* Thank you, Grandma.

To the over one hundred people who played their parts in the creation of this show, I thank you. Truly, it's a mystery how these things come together, a sort of minor miracle – and we need a few miracles and laughs these days! Given what's happening in our world today, the old theatre maxim "Fascism cries Farce!" remains apropos. We need laughter – silly belly laughter – not the sort born out of cynicism. With great gratitude, I am a teacher and director who has the privilege to make art, and by the gift of fortune, I have been included in a traditional process of giving, sharing, and

playing that was taught to me by my theatre mentors. There's now a line that travels through Shakespeare, back to the Greeks, and forward to these amazing young artists on stage today.

The intention behind what you are about to experience is to enthuse and enthrall young people about the theatre and to excite them to the works of Shakespeare. We, Homo Hermeneuticus are makers of meaning on our journey to, as the Delphic oracle says, "know thyself." In order to do that, we mimic behavior, we mirror it – or in the vernacular of music culture, we are sampling, making a mashup. Millennials understand the journey to self-identity as a performative act, framing and reframing their world through their digital devices. One of the platforms from where culture advances is the world of the music video, where the cutting edge of technology is a shared vocabulary, uniquely driven by youth themselves. Shakespearean theatre was the music video of his day.

Please encourage the young people in your life to come and experience our Shakespearean farce (from the French word "to stuff"). We hope you enjoy our feast!

Shakespeare was baptized on April 26, 1564. Based on what we know of the traditions of the time, a child is baptized three days after birth, meaning his birthday was April 23. However, Shakespeare was born under the Julian calendar and by today's Gregorian calendar, April 23 would translate to May 3.





Creative Team



Jeffrey Renn Director

On the advice of Martha Henry, Jeffrey studied at the London Academy of Music and Dramatic Arts. There he became a clown and certified stage combat director. He and Martha went on to perform in six shows together. Returning to Canada, Jeffrey worked at Bard on the Beach and helped create the Young Shakespeareans program. In Vancouver, he performed at the Vancouver Playhouse, the Cultch, Carousel Theatre, the Arts Club, and –

while holding a faculty position – the Gastown Actors Studio. His true acting training began in Edmonton under Robin Phillips in his company at the Citadel Theatre where he performed in a dozen shows over four seasons. Over the next ten years Jeffrey worked at Canada's two major repertory companies: Stratford and Shaw. While a member of the acting ensemble, he taught the Young Shavians program and the Stratford Festival's summer Shakespeare Academy. He has performed twice on Broadway, in Shakespeare's *Much Ado About Nothing* and Moliere's *The Miser*, and was in the world premiere of Australia's international hit *Topdogs*. He took a hiatus to become an organic farmer. After reaching the lofty wage of 35 cents per hour, he returned to the theatre to support his farming habit. He has proudly served as the artistic director for Realwheels Theatre Company, advocating for artists who live with disability, and currently works with the Kickstart Disability Arts Organization. He now resides on Salt Spring Island, building exitStageLeft's Summer Shakespeare program. Jeffrey is also an artist in residence at the Centre for Studies in Religion and Society at UVic where he is working on a musical adaptation of Tim Ward's *What the Buddha Never Taught*.





Wendell Clanton Musical Director

Wendell is a saxophone and vocal jazz performance instructor at the University of Victoria School of Music. He has performed extensively on radio and television, in major concert halls, and in local community venues for some thirty years. His student ensembles have received international acclaim. Known for his innovative teaching strategies and participatory workshops, Wendell enjoys creating original role playing games for performers and teachers (e.g., Penguin Party 2017) that foster literacy, expression and collaboration. Wendell's choral and instrumental compositions have been performed regionally and internationally.



Christina Penhale Choreographer

Christina graduated from Canadian College of Performing Arts with a scholarship for outstanding acting achievement. She has since worked in both theatre and film acting, directing, choreography and writing. Christina is currently the Co-Artistic Director of exitStageLeft Productions, a semi-professional theatre company on Salt Spring Island. Her most notable shows include **RENT**, **Into The Woods**, **Cabaret**, **Spamalot**, and Shakespeare's **A Midsummer Night's Dream** and **As You Like It**.



Patrick Du Wors Set Designer

Patrick is a faculty member and award-winning performance designer who works in a wide range of performance styles and scales of production. From site-specific opera, to texts from the classical cannon, to contemporary devised theatre, Patrick's work has been recognized across Canada and internationally. Collaborators include: The Banff Centre, Canadian Opera Co., Against the Grain, Ghost River, The Arcola (UK), Theatre Calgary, Alberta Theatre Projects, Buddies in Bad Times, Blue Bridge Theatre, The Grand, Persephone, The Belfry, Tarragon, and various independent ad-hoc collectives. Patrick designed and curated the Canadian exhibition at the 2015 Prague Quadrennial and is a member of the international artistic leadership team for PQ2019. www.patrickduwors.com




Brendan Agnew Stage Manager

Linda Hardy's Retirement

Unbelievably, our dear colleague, Professor Linda Hardy will be retiring this coming June. Linda has worked both nationally and internationally as a master teacher of Acting and Voice, training professional actors and singers for stage and film. Generations of undergraduate and graduate students have benefited from her vast knowledge and generosity of spirit. She has been an influential member of the department since 1975, and the breadth of her knowledge and teaching areas have been unmatched. Over the years, she has taught everything from Theatre History to Directing, to Acting, to Voice, and in every course, regardless of subject, she has imparted her wisdom and her enduring passion for theatre.

Linda has directed more than 18 memorable plays for our stages at the Phoenix Theatre, including productions of *Twelfth Night, Tartuff, Medea, The Skin of Our Teeth,* and *The Inspector*. On occasion, she has acted on our stages, including for the Phoenix Summer Theatre productions of *6 Rms Riv Vu* in 1976, *The Prime of Miss Jean Brodie* in 1983, and our mainstage production of *The Glass Menagerie* in 1986.

Linda also was key in helping the Phoenix establish international educational connections. In particular, her leadership was the guiding force behind the founding of the student exchange program with the Theatre program at the Chulalongkorn University in Bangkok.

In Victoria, Linda performed with the Bastion Theatre in **The Last Real Summer** in 1985 and afterwards was a founding member of the New Bastion Theatre Company, playing Juliet opposite John Krich's Romeo in 1992 for their Gala Fundraiser called "Murder At The Mac – The Romeo and Juliet Murders" (where they got to murder each other!).

As a voice master, Linda has shared her expertise in breath control with people who have respiratory issues. She frequently gives workshops on voice work and breath control, locally and in Thailand and India where she works with Tibetan monks and ritual masters. She is also an active member of the local Buddhist community.

Colleagues will miss Linda's integrity, her commitment to helping students fulfill their potential as artists and humans beings, the engaging conversations over Thai noodles or Japanese sushi, her graciousness, and her wonderful sense of style.

In honour of Linda's retirement, she will be awarding a Phoenix Retiree's Scholarship to a current student of her choice in our program.

Phoenix Phacts

Current student and 2016 Youth Poet Laureate, **Ann-Bernice Thomas**, was an opening performer at the Evening of Spoken Word, Poetry, Rock, Blues and Soul Music, presented in celebration of Black History Month at the Belfry Theatre.

Theatre Inconnu, founded by alumnus **Clayton Jevne (BFA '85, MFA '87 & PhD '03)**, is known as the longest surviving alternative theatre company in town. Their spring production of *Neva* by Guillermo Calderon, was directed by Jevne and featured current theatre and writing student **Nicholas Guerreiro**. 
