


Director's Notes



The Inspector, which is an adaptation of Nikolay Gogol's The Government Inspector, took me some five months to write over the course of last spring and summer. The play is intended as a study in comedy and satire in the light of up-to-date political and social goings on, not only in the world at large but also in our own back yard. Theatre has always served as a mirror in which we see our foibles, our "little passions and failings," as Mayor Gladhand puts it. And, while no one character in the play is a direct reflection of any one person, the behavior of most is recognizable to us all.

"Why do comedy?" is the question we put to our students. One answer is that it provides release in these uncertain times; another, that it has always been the responsibility of the artist to function as a catalyst, provocateur and, yes, "shit disturber," if you like. Gogol understood this in spades and was applauded as a "realist" in the Russia of his day. I'm grateful to him for his courage and panache.


I'm also grateful to the *Times Colonist*; especially the editorial pages, and the passion of the citizens writing their letters to the editor. It is in those pages



that one can feel the pulse of a community. Above all, I'm grateful to my editor, my terrific creative and production teams, and our delightful cast and crew for all they have done to bring this adaptation to fruition. For me, the greatest joy is the chance to write roles for my actors, knowing their needs as young artists, and the needs of the play. To "tailor make" a play that we all bring together makes for a rare collaboration. We hope you enjoy this home-grown contribution to our 50th Anniversary Season.

About Nikolay Gogol



Nikolay Gogol (1809–1852) was a Ukrainian-born Russian author and playwright whose satirical works criticized the Russian Empire. He quickly became famous after publishing Vechera na khutore bliz Dikanki (Evenings on a Farm near Dikanka), tales inspired by childhood memories and Ukrainian folklore (1831–1832). This success enabled him to continue publishing stories, including Mirigod (1835) and Arabeski (1835). In 1836, Gogol published his most famous play, Revizor (translated as either The Government Inspector or The Inspector General). This comedy raised such an outcry from Russian officials and reactionary press that Gogol moved

to Rome. The 1842 comic novel *Myortvye dushi* (*Dead Souls*) is considered his masterpiece. After a decade of writing a *Dead Souls* sequel, his religious beliefs eventually led him to denounce fiction as sinful and demonic, and during a fit of depression Gogol burned most of the manuscripts of the second volume. Devastated by what he had done afterwards, he took to bed and refused all food, dying nine days later.

Linda Hardy *Director*

Linda Hardy specializes in voice and acting, as well as supervising MFA students in the graduate directing program. Over the years, she has worked both nationally and internationally as a Master teacher training professional actors and singers for stage and film. Her therapeutic skills in voice work and breath control in particular are highly sought after, whether it is teaching actors in Thailand to sing western jazz or Tibetan monks in India techniques to protect their voices during the endless hours of throat chanting. She has also directed and taught in the USA, Thailand, Switzerland, and China. For the Phoenix, Linda has directed many shows and is delighted to be able to contribute her adaptation of Gogol's *The Inspector* for the Department of Theatre's 50th Anniversary Season.



Jeffrey Renn Assistant Director

Jeffrey Renn has been an actor, director, teacher, chef, bistro owner, gallery curator, organic farmer, wine and brandy maker, forager and clown, and – always – a master storyteller. He studied acting at the London Academy of Music and Dramatic Arts, and is an alumnus of both Shaw and Stratford Festivals; Jeffrey has also appeared on Broadway in Moliere's *The Miser* and Shakespeare's *Much Ado About Nothing*. Teaching has been an important part of his artistic practice, whether it has been in acting, directing, fight choreography or movement at the Gastown Actors Studio, George Brown College, the University of Winnipeg, Queensland University of Technology, Bond University, and the Lismore School of the Arts in Australia.



Delaney Tesch Set Designer

Delaney is a fourth-year design student, who originally started in stage management, but has gradually branched into design. Recent credits include costumes for *Crave* (MFA project, 2016), set and costumes for *O, Come All Ye Faithful* (SATCO, 2016), and *MUD* (MFA project, 2016), as well as two shows for the 2016 Victoria Fringe Festival: costumes for *Birdwatching* (First and Last Productions), and production design for *Art of the Eight Limbs* (Vino Buono). Jacques Lemay Choreographer

Jacques has directed and choreographed hundreds of theatre and opera productions across Canada, as well as film and television. He is a former Artistic Director of the Charlottetown Festival and founding director of the Jazz Dance department for the Royal Winnipeg Ballet. He gained renown as a choreographer for the RWB and other international companies. He was Artistic Director and Senior Choreographer of the Calgary Olympics Opening Ceremonies; Producer/Artistic Director of the 1994 Victoria Commonwealth Games, Special Olympics World Winter Games, Canada Summer and Winter Games, Opening Ceremonies of Confederation Bridge; Creative Advisor for the Vancouver Olympics Opening and Closing Ceremonies; and Artistic Director of six Royal visits. He has been retained by the Canada Council for the Arts and provincial and territorial arts councils. Mr. Lemay co-founded the Canadian College of Performing Arts. Following his recent work on **Simon Boccanegra** for Pacific Opera Victoria, he is currently choreographing the company's production of *Magic Flute* and will appear in the season's final production of *Les Feluettes*. He is scheduled to re-stage *Les Feluettes* next season for Edmonton Opera.



Rebecca Marchand Stage Manager



Theatre professor Jennifer Wise's new play, *A Queer Trial*, will be performed on April 14 in Bastion Square, the site of a sensational event in Victoria's history. In 1860, an openly gay man was acquitted there of sodomy charges by two successive juries – the first of which preferred to spend a night in jail rather than convict him. Wise found the story while researching *The Girl Rabbi of the Golden West*, a site-specific comedy she wrote for Congregation Emanu-El's 150th anniversary. A satirical, musical celebration of an unsung hero of LGBT history, *A Queer Trial* is the culmination of a new course in site-specific theatre being funded by UVic's Office for Community-

University Engagement. The project unites the creativity and research of faculty, students, and alumni, and mobilizes the knowledge of members of BC's indigenous, LGBT, Jewish, Black, and legal communities.

As well as a playwright, Wise is a theatre historian, translator, and visual artist. Her translation of Brecht's *The Resistible Rise of Arturo Ui*, created for the Phoenix in 2002 and now produced internationally, was chosen by Brecht's heirs as the first English version of this play to be published in 40 years (Methuen, 2013). Other plays include her version of Aristophanes' *Frogs* (Phoenix, 2000), and *Orbit*, a historical drama about Galileo's children written for the International Year of Astronomy (2009). Her book *Dionysus Writes* (Cornell, 1998), about the invention of theatre in ancient Athens, is read around the world.

Dr. Wise retires at the end of 2017 after 21 years at UVic. She is loved by her students for her creative ability to bring history to life, and her inspiring passion for theatre – and life in general – will be greatly missed.




