

Director's Notes



When I applied for MFA programs two years ago, part of the appeal of the University of Victoria's Theatre program was that it was as far away from my home in Newfoundland as possible. As an added bonus: I didn't know a soul in Victoria, and I had no idea what I would find here. At the Phoenix Theatre, I have been guided by brilliant artists and driven by fierce artistic collaborators. What have I found? Purpose.

The bulk of my work at the Phoenix has been feminist in nature. Through this (self-identified) "Feminist tirade" of shows, I have re-defined myself in many ways. Two years ago, I would not

have classified myself a feminist; now, I have found feminism to be the driving force for my artistic life.

I instantly gravitated to the *Gut Girls* script. This distinctly feminist work spoke to me with its examination of current issues within the historical period of the 1890s and its poignant advocacy for women's reproductive rights, equal pay, and domestic recognition. The inherent feminism is furthered by the piece's depiction of hyper masculinity, class distinctions, and rape culture.

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3837 Cadboro Bay Rd. 250.384.2688 Theatre provides a comment on our social context, and through the rehearsal process of *Gut Girls* I have been constantly reminded to question what we deem "acceptable." The script demands that we re-examine and deconstruct the gender binary. I am proud to have collaborated with a group of feminists to create a piece of theatre that lives in 1899 and breathes in 2017.

About the Playwright

Sarah Daniels (1957 –) is a British playwright whose career took off in the early 1980s when three of her plays were produced in rapid succession: *Penumbra* (Sheffield University), *Ma's Flesh is Grass* (Crucible Studio Theatre), and *Ripen Our Darkness* (Royal Court Theatre). All of Daniel's plays center around the themes of women's struggles and exploitations. *Masterpieces* (1983) details how pornography breeds violence against women and *The Devil's Gateway* (1983) was inspired by the women's peace camp at Greenham Common. She became an associate writer in residence at the Royal Court Theatre, and later, the resident writer at the Albany Empire Theatre. In 1989, Daniels began writing for television and radio and spent several decades writing for BBC programmes including *Grange Hill* and *Eastenders*. Currently, she is on the board of Clean Break Theatre, a company dedicated to working with women prisoners and ex-offenders.

Alix Reynolds Director

Alix hails from St. John's, Newfoundland and holds a BA in English and a Diploma in Performance and Communications from Memorial University. In 2012, Alix founded Joint Productions alongside a team of enthusiastic friends. This team continues to be active in the St. John's theatre community today. Joint Productions credits as director include: Edward Albee's The Goat or Who is Sylvia?, Sam Shepard's Fool for Love, Norm Foster's Jenny's House of Joy, Hedwig and the Angry **Inch** by John Cameron Mitchell (and a slew of Daniel MacIvor plays). As a transplant from the east coast, Alix feels privileged to have called Vancouver Island home for the last two years. At the University of Victoria, MFA projects include three studio plays: Daniel MacIvor's In On It, Maria Irene Fornes' **Mud**, and Sarah Kane's **Crave**. Alix is thrilled to be working on Sarah Daniels' Gut Girls with a team of exquisite students. This project has been a true collaboration, complemented by the generosity of the actors, the care of the stage management team, and the precision of the designers. 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
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
