Director's Notes

Having spent the last many months living with William Inge's *Picnic* in my head and going through stacks of research, I thought I might be ready to direct the play. I was only partly ready. Enter our gifted and inspired company of actors and designers, and our skilled and dedicated production team. Only then did the journey begin in earnest – and what a profound journey it has been!

I've been aware of this play since seeing Jackie Maxwell's Shaw Festival production over a decade ago. I've always felt it was the right play for our students. The play is classic in its form, placing us in one location over a period of twenty-four hours. Our acting company has had the opportunity to discover the complexities of what appear to be simple characters. Our design team has had the challenge of taking us to a small town in Kansas in 1950.

I can't and won't tell you what the play is "about". I can't tell you because my perspective on the play shifts when an actor introduces a new dimension to their character, when set designer Jonathan Maxwell introduces an insightful image, when costume designer Pauline Stynes fits a costume on an actor, or sound designer Colette Habel introduces a piece of music. I won't tell you because my hope is that you will discover your own meaning of the play and why it's relevant in 2014. Great plays ask important questions. It is my firm belief that Mr. Inge is still asking important and provocative questions through the characters in *Picnic*.

Thank you for coming to the Phoenix to support and celebrate our collaborative and academic endeavours in the Department of Theatre. You are witnessing a shining example of experiential learning at its best.

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About the Playwright



The renowned American playwright William Inge (1913-1973) is the author of several successful dramas. Many of his works were influenced by his childhood in the small town of Independence, Kansas. After a string of jobs as a labour worker, teacher, and news announcer, Inge eventually found his way into the world of theatre as a drama and music critic for the *St. Louis Times* in 1943. It was during this time he met Tennessee Williams, and this acquaintance led to him accompanying Williams to a performance of his play *The Glass Menagerie*. Inspired by Williams' work, Inge returned to St. Louis to write a play of his own.

Three months later he completed *Farther From Heaven*. Shortly thereafter Inge went back to teaching as an instructor at Washington University while working on a project that would eventually become his drama *Come Back, Little Sheba*, a play that would earn him the title of Broadway's Most Promising Playwright during its 1950 season. *Picnic* premiered in 1953 at the Music Box Theatre in New York City. This drama in particular was inspired by Inge's childhood in small town Kansas, and it won him a Pulitzer Prize, The Drama Circle Award, the Outer Circle Award, and the Theatre Club Award. Inge's success continued through the 1950s with film adaptations of his plays *Picnic* and *Bus Stop* (the latter of which featured Marilyn Monroe in a starring role) and the premiere of what is considered to be his finest work, *Dark at the Top of the Stairs*. Sadly, this would be Inge's last theatrical hit as *A Loss of Roses, Natural Affection* and *Where's Daddy?* were all met with critical disdain and closed early into their respective runs. This turn of events caused Inge to return to his teaching career, only to retire in 1970 and write two novels, *Good Luck, Miss Wyckoff* and *My Son is a Splendid Driver* while becoming increasingly depressed. Inge committed suicide at the age of 60 in 1973 and was buried in his hometown.

Peter McGuire Director

Beginning at Victoria's McPherson Playhouse, Peter has enjoyed a 30-year career in the professional theatre that has included stage management, production management, talent management, administration and producing. He has worked at several major regional theatres including long-term residencies at the National Arts Centre, the Charlottetown Festival and the Stratford Festival. He has toured regionally, nationally and internationally and worked for the Maybox Group of theatres in London's West End. Between 2003 and 2005 he was Associate Conservatory Director at the American Conservatory Theatre in San Francisco. Peter currently teaches acting, directing, production, and introductory theatre courses to students from across the campus.



Jonathan Maxwell Set Designer

Jonathan is a fourth-year design student. Between completing a degree in film in 2005 and returning to school he has worked on hundreds of projects in theatre, film, television and events. Highlights include designing the Finnish premieres of musicals <code>Honk!</code> and <code>Altar Boyz</code>, directing Jonathan Larson's <code>Tick, Tick... Boom!</code> and managing the construction of the Louis Vuitton Helsinki Grand Opening. Other work includes set designing <code>The Skin of Our Teeth</code> (Phoenix), adapting Neil Gaiman's short story <code>We Can Get Them for You Wholesale</code> (SATCo), and being the assistant director for <code>Soho Cinders</code> (a new musical in London's West End) and <code>Reasons to Be Pretty</code> (Phoenix).



Pauline Stynes Costume Designer

After training and a career in tailoring and costuming, Pauline's love of theatre and desire to create beautiful costumes inspired her to returned to school for her BFA in Design. She is absolutely honoured to be the costume designer for *Picnic*, her first mainstage production. Pauline was the Wardrobe Supervisor for *Eurydice* (Phoenix) and has also worked on several local professional productions including, *A Christmas Carol* (Belfry), *Let Me Call You Sweetheart* (Belfry), *My Fair Lady* (Blue Bridge), and *Smalltown: A Pick Up Musical* (Theatre SKAM). Most recently she was Head of Wardrobe for the world-premiere production of the opera, *Marilyn Forever* (Aventa Ensemble).



Allan Stichbury Lighting Designer

Recent productions at the University of Victoria include set designs for *You're a Good Man, Charlie Brown; Inside; Twelfth Night;* and *Yerma*. Beyond the university, recent credits include set designs for *The Rake's Progress* and *Flying Dutchman* at Pacific Opera Victoria, *The Barber of Seville* at the Vancouver Opera, *One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest* at Theatre Calgary and The Royal Manitoba Theatre Centre, set and lighting design for *Communion* at Alberta Theatre Projects and lighting design for *God of Carnage* at Theatre Calgary. He has been working with Bangkok University to establish a Student Exchange Agreement and Memo of Understanding with UVic. The first exchange students are now in Bangkok and working on projects. Allan is a past president of Associated Designers of Canada.

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
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
