A king and his friends swear an oath to renounce the pursuit of love and focus on their studies, but upon meeting a princess and her maids, their oath is tested.

Much Ado About Nothing

Beatrice, a confirmed spinster, and Benedick, an eternal bachelor, are each duped into believing the other is in love with them.

The Taming of the Shrew

Lucentio wishes to marry Bianca, but cannot do so until her feisty older sister, Katherine, is married. Petruchio uses several tactics to turn Katherine into an obedient wife.

King Lear

When King Lear banishes Cordelia, the only daughter who truly loved him, Lear goes mad, and Cordelia returns to do battle.

A Midsummer Night's Dream

Four Athenians run away to the forest, each pursuing one another. The mischievous Puck plays tricks on them, causing each to fall in love with the wrong person.

Macbeth

Spurred by the prophecy of witches and the persistent urging of his wife, General Macbeth kills the King of Scotland to take the crown for himself, but paranoia's grasp causes him to spiral and civil unrest ensues.

The Winter's Tale

Leontes falsely accuses his wife, Hermione, of infidelity and exiles his newborn daughter, Perdita. She is raised by shepherds for 16 years, before falling in love with the prince from a neighbouring kingdom.

As You Like It

Disguised as a shepherd-boy, Rosalind attempts to cure Orlando of his love for her, which only results in their love growing.

Measure for Measure

In order to free her brother, Claudio, from prison, Isabella is given the ultimatum of sleeping with his captor, or losing her brother forever.

All's Well that Ends Well

Hellen must complete a list of tasks to gain the love of Bertram following his rejection.

Othello

Furious about being overlooked, lago manipulates his friend and general, Othello, into believing that his wife Desdemona is unfaithful to him, sending Othello into a spiralling rage of jealousy.

Antony and Cleopatra

Mark Antony returns from Rome to his mistress, Cleopatra, in Egypt to face a battle against his enemy, Octavius.


Romeo and Juliet

About Libby Appel

Appel is the Artistic Director Emerita of the Oregon Shakespeare Festival. She has worked as an educator and as an artistic director across America, while also directing a number of plays across the country. Libby has focused on the works of Anton Chekov and William Shakespeare. Her deep love of the works of Anton Chekhov are showcased in the documentary, *Meeting with Chekhov* (a Coffee and Language film). She has recently completed five new translations of Chekhov's plays along with Russian-to-English translator, Allison Horsley. She is the recipient of the Stephen and Christine Schwarzman Award for Excellence: Lifetime Achievement in Theater, awarded at the Kennedy Center in 2010.



About William Shakespeare

Shakespeare's collection of work includes a variety of poems, 154 sonnets, and 38 plays - 16 of which will be highlighted here tonight. While no original manuscripts of Shakespeare's plays are known to exist, a group of actors from Shakespeare's company was able to collect 36 scripts after Shakespeare died. They were brought together in what is known as the *First Folio*. His plays, sonnets, and poems were compiled in various iterations of *The Complete Works of William Shakespeare*. His legacy is as rich and diverse as his work, which has spawned countless adaptations across multiple genres and cultures, as well as an enduring presence in film. Over 400 years later, William Shakespeare continues to be one of the most important literary figures of the English language.



Notes from the Director

Shakespeare's Women: Back to the Future

For over 400 years the stories of Shakespeare's women of will have engaged their audiences in conversations on subjects such as love, power, sex, and motherhood. In their infinite variety, they have loved, been in love, revenge-filled, mournful, passionate, and merciful. When William Shakespeare wrote these characters, women were not allowed to perform them on the public stage. These women were seen through the lens of a man playing a woman and sometimes a man playing a woman playing a man. What was it that allowed Shakespeare to have such an ability to recognize and articulate these thoughts and desires? Some say it was his relationship with Emilia Lanier Bassano the Jewish, African, Italian woman who was a court musician and also the first published female poet in England. Esteemed Artistic Director of Shakespeare & Co, Tina Packer states in her book **Women of Will: The Remarkable Evolution of Shakespeare's Female Characters** that the women in Shakespeare's plays begin to gain complexity and nuance around the time in Shakespeare's life that we believe he came involved with Emilia.

As a director, I have always approached my work through the lens of social change and political activism. In choosing to revisit these women in a time of plague and turmoil, we look through a lens very similar to Shakespeare's own time. It is when we begin to isolate these women's stories and dialogs that we truly begin to wonder at their incredible complexity and continued relevance in today's society.

I would like to thank Dr. Vickery for this kind invitation. I hope you enjoy the production.
