Newfoundland born trumpeter and guitarist Dr. Patrick Boyle is Assistant Professor of Jazz Studies at the University of Victoria. CBC Radio calls Patrick a "trumpet personality" and "one of Canada's top trumpet players and jazz musicians in general." He blends a range of influences into a compelling original voice.

Patrick is an in-demand session player unbound by genre. He can be heard on more than 45 recordings and three critically acclaimed solo albums: Rock Music (2010) with percussionist Curtis Andrews; Still No Word (2008); and Hold Out (2005). Patrick performed at Carnegie Hall with tabla virtuoso Zakir Hussain and drummer Steve Smith in 2009. At UVic, he teaches courses in jazz theory, history, improvisation, arranging, and directs the Jazz Orchestra.
