Spiraling by Vivian Fung

String Quartet No. 5 "Spiraling" was written as a reflection on the tumultuous year that was 2021. With a relentless series of local and international incidents, including the storming of the US Capitol, widening political divisions, and culture wars; forests burning throughout the western United States, Canada, Brazil, and Australia; coups and assassinations in Afghanistan, Myanmar, and Haiti; and new and ever more virulent COVID variations, the list continued to spiral out of control as the year went on and took a tremendous emotional toll on me. It seemed that the only constant in our world was change, continual change.

Reflecting that continual change, the quartet is a *tour de force* work in one movement that is constantly moving and morphing from one figure to the next, often spiraling in circular motions repeating patterns of arpeggios or chords. Like a musical kalei-doscope, the quartet uses one motive from the very beginning but it weaves in and out in different colors and emotions, from the angst-filled beginning, through a more gentle transition with use of harmonics as color, to a playful section that is sporadic and eventually grooves to a beat. In addition to the opening motivic figure, a central melodic idea permeates the piece and closes the piece as a lament, filled with both sorrow and hope as it seeks to reassure.

JUNO Award-winning composer **Vivian Fung** has a unique talent for combining idiosyncratic textures and styles into large-scale works, reflecting her multicultural background. NPR calls her "one of today's most eclectic composers."

Highlights of performances this season include tonight's world premiere of the fifth String Quartet by the Lafayette Quartet, a new piece for Houston's ROCO; international performances of her critically-acclaimed elegy for the pandemic, *Prayer*; and the European premieres of *A Child's Dream of Toys* and *Baroque Melting*. Mary Elizabeth Bowden tours her Trumpet Concerto to Philharmonia Northwest, Waynesboro Symphony, San José Chamber Orchestra. Fung is the 2023 Composer-in-Residence at Alba Music Festival Composition Program in Italy.

She is at work on new projects with librettist Royce Vavrek, Network for New Music, Ensemble for These Times, and the Cape Cod Chamber Music Society. An album of Fung's first four string quartets by the Jasper Quartet will be released on Sono Luminus in 2023, and Elizabeth Bowden has recorded her Trumpet Concerto for future release on Çedille Records.

As a composer whose trips often inspire her music, Fung has also explored diverse cultures in China, North Vietnam, Spain, and Indonesia. With a grant from the Canada Council, she and Royce Vavrek will travel to Cambodia in 2023 to continue research for a new opera based on her family's experience surviving the Cambodian genocide.

Fung is a passionate mentor for young composers, is an associate composer of the Canadian Music Centre, and served on the board of the American Composers Forum. Born in Canada, Fung received her doctorate from The Juilliard School. She currently lives in California. Learn more at www.vivianfung.ca.
