BIOGRAPHIES

Dr. Gerald King

Dr. King is Professor of Music at the University of Victoria where he is Head of Music Education, Graduate Wind Conducting, and serves as the conductor of the UVic Wind Symphony. From 2004-12 he served as Director of the School of Music.

Internationally recognized as one of Canada's most respected conductors, adjudicators, educators and keynote speakers, Dr. King is the recipient of numerous honors and awards, including the Order of the Phoenix by the Western International Band Clinic where he has made 7 separate conducting appearances; election into Phi Beta Mu; election into the American Bandmasters Association (2003) when he served as guest conductor of the United States Army Band (Pershing's Own) from Washington, DC; recipient of the British Columbia Music Educators' Honorary Life Award "in recognition of a lifetime of commitment of time, talent, and energies to music education in British Columbia;" and, in 2015 he was inducted as an Honorary Member of the Naden Band of the Royal Canadian Navy "for fostering tremendous goodwill towards the band, heightened morale and esprit de corps, and providing an exceptional liaison between the military and the public."

Dr. King's background is varied. Although he is primarily recognized as a conductor of wind bands, he is equally comfortable conducting orchestras and choirs. He is a former student of internationally renowned conductor, Maestro Kazuyoshi Akiyama with whom he studied the Saito Conducting Technique. His professional career has taken him throughout Canada, the United States, Great Britain, Denmark, Sweden, Holland, Germany, Italy, France, Spain, Japan, Mexico, Hong Kong, Australia, Switzerland, Austria, Slovakia and the Czech Republic. Dr. King's conducting appearances with regional, national, international honor, and professional ensembles have been praised for performance quality, artistry, and creativity.

In addition to his passion for making music he is also widely recognized as an expert for his ability to link theory and practice in the field of teaching and learning. Among his many recordings and publications is a chapter in the book, *Creativity and Music Education*, written by seventeen authors from the United States, Canada, Israel, Australia, Great Britain, Spain, and Scotland. The book includes a forward by noted author on creativity, Mihalyi Csikszentmihalyi. Dr. King has also completed a well-received DVD—*The Craft of Conducting*.

Dr. King is in great demand as a conductor, adjudicator, clinician, and keynote speaker. Over the past 25 years he has worked with over 10,000 ensembles and soloists representing more than 500,000 musicians. Dr. King is a Yamaha Artist Educator/Conductor.

Lieutenant (Navy) Vincent Roy, CD Commanding Officer & Director of Music

Born in Quebec City in 1981, Lieutenant (Navy) Vincent Roy joined the Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) as a reservist in 2001 and performed subsequently on tuba and piano with La Musique du NCSM Montcalm and La Musique des Voltigeurs de Québec. In 2006, he was offered a position in the Regular Force, and was posted to La Musique du Royal 22e Régiment in Valcartier, QC. During his time with the Royal 22e Régiment he performed internationally and wrote numerous musical arrangements. Having an avid interest in conducting, Lt(N) Roy studied with Gilles Auger before being selected to take on the position of Bandmaster of the 14 Wing Greenwood Band in Nova Scotia. In July 2015, he was posted to Borden, ON, to complete the Music Officer Course, studying with Dr. Gillian Mackay at University of Toronto. In July 2016, Lt(N) Roy became the 21st Music Director and Commanding Officer of the Naden Band of the Royal Canadian Navy.

David P. Gagnon

Born in Quebec, David P. Gagnon joined the Canadian Forces Reserve in Sherbrooke in 2003 where he played and eventually conducted until 2012 when he was accepted as a Regular Force member with the Naden Band of the Royal Canadian Navy and moved to Victoria. Since then, apart from playing saxophone in the ensemble and as a soloist, you can see him as the Drum Major in front of the Band on parade or in the recording studio when needed. Mr. Gagnon has also helped produce all of the latest recordings of the Naden Band: Snapshots of Excellence, Portraits of Excellence, and Undercurrents, which features the music of Robert Buckley.

In Quebec, David performed with his saxophone quartet and a variety of big bands and concert bands. He taught saxophone, flute and clarinet and conducted elementary to high school level bands. He also toured Quebec with the well-known singer Dan Bigras conducting his big band and performing at the Montreal Jazz Festival. David is involved in the Vancouver Island musical community as an adjudicator and guest conductor.

Mr. Gagnon studied saxophone and recording at the College de Sherbrooke before graduating from McGill University in Music with Honors in Music Technology. He completed his Master of Music Degree in Conducting at UVic under the supervision of Dr. Gerald King in 2016, where he had the opportunity to conduct the UVic Wind Symphony as well as saxophone and trombone ensembles.

Susan Young

Susan Young is a long-time member of the UVic School of Music, working mainly with voice students and choirs. She has been active performing a wide and diverse repertoire of art songs and aria from before Bach to after Schoenberg. She enjoys teaching, conducting, and singing with any make-up and size of ensemble, and is delighted to join the UVic students and the Naden Band as a visiting member for this concert.
