BIOGRAPHIES

Ajtony Csaba, UVic Symphony Orchestra conductor

Ajtony Csaba is music director of the UVic Symphony Orchestra (UViSO) and conductor of the Central-European Chamber Orchestra (mikamo) in Vienna. Recently, he worked with the Frankfurt Radio Orchestra (hr-sinfonieorchester), the Hungarian Radio Orchestra, the Transparent Sound Festival in Budapest, and members of the Ensemble Intercontemporain in Paris. Past years have seen him conducting most major Hungarian orchestras, Radio-Symphonieorchester Vienna, Wroclaw Philharmonic Orchestra, as well as reoccurring engagements at the Darmstadt New Music Festival, SiMN (Curitiba - BR) and Wien Modern. He is co-founder of the SALT Festival in Victoria.

Csaba started off by winning prizes as a composer in Hungary, Austria and later in Germany. His opera conducting debut was for the Hungarian premiere of Shostakovich's *Cheryomoushki*. He graduated from the University of Music Vienna with distinction and worked as Kapellmeister at the Studiobühne Wein. As conductor of the multimedia concert cycles *Hermes* and *recycled* in 2008–2010, he directed the Central European Chamber Orchestra in the prime concert halls of Bratislava, Prague, Cracow, Bucharest, Budapest, the Konzerthaus, and Austrian Broadcast in Vienna as well as concert tours in China. His research on conducting gestures has been featured at conferences of the Oxford Conducting Institute and ISGS 7th International Conference in Paris. Csaba has recently completed the recording of orchestral compositions by Canadian composer Istvan Anhalt with the SALT Festival Orchestra and the Hungarian Radio Symphony Orchestra, for the label Centrediscs.

Dr. Adam Jonathan Con, UVic Chorus director

Dr. Adam Jonathan Con is Associate Professor of Music in the Faculty of Fine Arts. He currently serves as Co-Head of Music Education and conducts the UVic Symphonic Chorus which serves all majors of the university from first year to doctoral students, staff, faculty along with a long-standing tradition of Victoria community participation. His teaching duties include music education foundations and methods courses and the Faculty of Fine Arts ADEI (Access, Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion) course. Dr. Con coordinates Graduate Choral Conducting, and serves as graduate faculty supervisor for the graduate accordion applied area. At the university level Dr. Con serves as Chair of the Senate Committee on Curriculum and has recently completed 2 years as Acting Associate Dean for the Faculty of Fine Arts. One of Dr. Con's favorite service duties is coordinating all the music and musicians for UVic's convocations as well as serving as convocation organist.

A respected music educator, choral conductor and teacher of choral conducting, his invitations to perform, conduct and present workshops include: Foro Coro Americano in Argentina, I Foro Internacional De Educación Musical in Mexico, HCES Music Festival in Australia, Podium Choral Conducting Symposium, ISMEThe International Society for Music Education, the Canadian GALA Conference, the Canadian and the American Orff-Schulwerk Conferences, the Manitoba, Alberta, Saskatchewan and British Columbia Provincial Music Educator's Conferences, the British Columbia Choral Federation, the Unitarian Universalist Musicians National American Conference, the Ohio and Georgia State Music Educator's Conferences and the American Choral Directors Association. Recently, Dr. Con completed an historic 3-year National Study on the State of K-12 Music Education in Canada as the principal researcher for the Canadian Coalition for Music Education.

Dr. Kinza Tyrrell, UVic Chamber Singers director

A Victoria native, Dr. Kinza Tyrrell is one of Canada's finest collaborators and a steadily rising figure in the world of opera. She has extensive experience in choral conducting, vocal coaching and accompaniment, having been a graduate of the Merola Opera Program, Tanglewood Festival and the Canadian Opera Company Ensemble Studio. Some career highlights include singing with the UofT Gospel Choir, touring the US with Bending the Bows, touring BC with Richard Margison, singing Lady Macbeth at the VOA's public Dress Rehearsal of Macbeth, playing Rachmaninov's Paganini Variations with the VSO, performing with Measha Brueggergosman at the 2010 Vancouver Winter Olympics, recording Hollywood movie soundtracks with the VFO, recording Ukrainian artsongs with Benjamin Butterfield at CBC in Toronto, conducting Nico Muhly's opera Dark Sisters at VOA and being an IZombie organist. Her most memorable opera moments are sessions with the linguist Nico Castel, where he shared entertaining stories related to diction and language. At UVic, Dr. Tyrrell is the Music Director of the Chamber Singers and also the Director of the Voice Ensemble class, Singing for the Stage.
