An internationally acclaimed choral conductor, **Bruce More** has for 35 years been a major contributor to the musical life of Victoria. Founder of the Music Department of Malaspina College, summer choral programme of the Courtenay Youth Music Camp, Vancouver Island Opera Society (now Pacific Opera), the Prima Choir, and the UVic Chamber Singers, conductor of the Victoria Choral Society, and frequent guest conductor of the Victoria Symphony Orchestra. In 2006, he received the Herbert Drost award for lifetime service to choral music in BC.

Connie Foss More is the Founding Artistic Director of Victoria's VIVA Choirs: singers aged 6-16 who love worldwide folk and art repertoire. Advanced groups have earned international as well as local praise, plus many VIVA singers have "graduated" to Bruce's choirs. She's been a teacher since 1969, with students of all ages in childcare centres, public schools, universities and at the Victoria Conservatory of Music. This year her career was honoured by the BC Choral Federation, and she is the current President of the Kodály Society of Canada - an organization which continues to fuel her desire to bring the power of meaningful music into everyone's lives.
