

A Farewell to Open Door Pioneer Lawrence Edward Moon August 5, 1927 - August 21, 2011

It is with profound sadness that the family of Lawrence Moon announces his passing at the age of 84. During the past several weeks while



in hospital, Lawrence maintained his ever gracious, gentle, and positive manner with everyone around him. He never wavered in his conviction that the Spirit of God held him and all of us in loving arms. From an early age, Lawrence had a deep sense of calling to work with people. He began his professional life with the YMCA as Director of Youth Work, which included a position at the Lake Edith camp near Jasper, AB. Later he began a long and influential ministry with the United Church, first at North Hill and Riverview United (Calgary, AB) and then First United (Victoria, B.C.). Lawrence was a progressive thinker and innovative leader and nurtured many, especially young people, in their journey toward an open- minded and heart-felt experience of faith. He was a pioneer in helping to establish Diaconal Ministry in the United Church. Lawrence responded strongly to the needs of the disadvantaged especially in Victoria's inner city. His vision and hard work led to the founding of the Open Door Ministry where, with a team of wonderful like-minded people, there was "unconditional love given in a nonjudgmental way". He will be greatly missed by all who were touched by his eager delight in life. "We will always love you and hold you deep in our hearts."
