I'm a volunteer and am approached by a donor asking to be able to make a monetary donation on the spot .. what should I do?

Answer: Dear Gentle Reader, the reputation of any organization corporate or non-profit, is only as good as its ethical handling of finances (ask any accountant!). At Our Place, the receiving and recording of monetary donations has to be squeaky clean!! Read my botoxed lips... volunteers should not handle either cash or cheque donations at all- staff do. Staff members are accountable for proper handling of donations. The name, address, phone number, and amount of the gift are recorded and sealed in an envelope and put in a secure place. If it is a cash donation, a receipt is offered.

As a volunteer, you can do a lot to help treat donors like royalty because in a way they are. Greet them warmly, thank them as you escort them to staff and even offer to watch their car if they have dashed in with their gift. Make it an easy and enjoyable experience for them.

Safety Corner

During the cold weather family are sleeping in our facility at any time of the day or night that they have access and on any piece of bare floor that they can find. Last week a near disaster was prevented when a woman was found asleep along the wall at the end of the food table. Two water urns were on an unstable table just above her head. Volunteers are encouraged to survey the areas they walk through. Please report to staff any situation which you feel is potentially dangerous. If the hazard seems high, please stay nearby until staff have arrived to waken the sleeper.
