

"More than a decade after our fellow citizens began bedding down on the sidewalks, their problems continue to seem so intractable that we have begun to do psychologically what government has been incapable of doing programmatically. Bus Passes

The program is open to all Our Place staff and regular volunteers, The cost is \$29.02 bi-weekly.... Or \$58.04 each month.. except for 2 months where there are 3 pay periods. In 2008 this is in February and July (the cost would be \$87.06 for those months).

Passes are only good in the CRD. (the annual savings is just under 2 months worth of monthly bus passes)

Participants receive a swipe card with their photo on it (which doesn't expire & therefore saves the hassle of obtaining new cards monthly). Pictures taken at BC Transit administration office on Garbally/Gorge Road

People MUST sign up for ONE YEAR. May opt out if job / shifts changes or place of residence renders the program inoperable – or balance of year payment is required.

Tax Exempt bus pass – a tax credit may be claimed on income tax return. Volunteers will be issued a receipt for the annual amount paid & # of months paid

Where a person has an existing monthly pass, BC Transit will refund a prorata amount so that people are not paying twice in the initial month of sign up.

Should a person no longer volunteer/work for OPS, they must surrender their pass

Volunteers would have to provide OPS with post-dated cheques for the 1st of each month for the month cost.
