Leonid Andreyev and his times

(1871-1919)

Leonid Andreyev was one of Russia's most successful writers before the Revolution in 1917. An accomplished playwright and poet as well as a painter and pioneer in the new art of photography, he wrote numerous plays, articles and books. Early in his career he was encouraged by his friend Maxim Gorky to embrace the Russian tradition of socially responsible writing. Andreyev became a controversial figure both admired and hated for his candid views about the political and social hypocrisy he saw around him. His writings reflected his preoccupation with the fundamental questions of good and evil and the destructive nature of man.

Andreyev wrote *HE Who Gets Slapped* in 1914 at a time when Russia was entering into a succession of unparalleled catastrophic events: World War I, the Russian Revolution and the bloody Civil War that followed. Although the play reflects the theatrical realism of the day, Andreyev also paid homage to the symbolist movement by using the circus as an allegorical tool. The use of allegory was not entirely unusual, however; unlike their slapstick North American counterparts, clowns in Europe were always political satirists.


In 1917, Andreyev was forced to flee Russia after speaking out against the Bolsheviks. He was disillusioned by the ruthless Civil War and died in Finland in 1919. For years his writings were suppressed in Soviet Russia but they have been re-discovered with growing appreciation there and in North America over the last half-century.



Daniel Stearns Translator

Dan is a lecturer at the University of Chicago where he also did his graduate studies in the Department of Slavic Languages and Literatures. His studies focused on Russian poetry and drama, especially their linguistic and formal aspects. Current and planned translation projects from Russian include Gorky's *The Lower Depths*, Erdman's *The Suicide* and the works of Alexander Vampilov. Dan has worked as both an actor and theatre technician in Chicago. Technical credits include Chicago Opera Theater, Light Opera Works, Court Theatre and Theatre on the Lake. He is

also the technical director of the student theatre at the University of Chicago. As an actor, favorite roles include Nathaniel in *Love's Labour's Lost*; Lord/Baptista in *The Taming of the Shrew*; Barnette Lloyd in *Crimes of the Heart* and John/James in *Love! Valour! Compassion!* In 1998, while Dan was simultaneously studying Russian literature and working and performing in theatre, he merged the two great interests in his life and began the translation of *HE Who Gets Slapped*, his first dramatic translation.





Brian Richmond Director

Current Chair of the Department of Theatre at UVic, Brian was born and raised in Vancouver and trained at Vancouver's Holiday Theatre and École Lecoq in Paris. He obtained his MA in drama from the University of Toronto. He has taught and/or created productions for several of Canada's foremost universities. As a professional director, Brian has created numerous productions for leading theatres throughout Canada and the U.S. He was founding Artistic Director of Saskatoon's

Persephone Theatre and served as Artistic Director for Montreal's Playwrights Workshop, Thunder Bay's Magnus Theatre and Toronto's Theatre Passe Muraille. A four-time nominee for Outstanding Director in the Dora Mavor Moore Awards, Brian won this award for his 1988 production of *Fire*. This production (as well as *Lillies* in 1999) was also chosen as Outstanding Production. Brian's most recent professional directing credits include his son Jacob's new play *Small Returns* for the Infinit Theatre/November Co. in Montreal (which will have its Toronto premiere at Theatre Passe Muraille in 2004); *A Lesson Before Dying* at the Florida Studio Theater and *Proof* for the Belfry Theatre (recently awarded the Victoria Critic's Choice Award for Best Professional Production). For the Phoenix, Brian has directed *Frogs*, *Peer Gynt* and *The Resistible Rise of Arturo Ui*.



Mary Kerr Production Designer

Mary has designed sets and costumes for the Shaw, Stratford and Banff Festivals and for major Canadian regional theatres. Her opera and ballet design includes work with such companies as the Canadian and Vancouver Opera companies, Paris Opera, Royal Winnipeg Ballet and National Ballet of Canada. In 1994 Mary was Production Designer for the Opening and Closing Ceremonies of the Commonwealth Games in Victoria. Professional acknowledgements include seven Dora Mavor

Moore and three Sterling awards. Mary has twice represented Canada at the Prague Quadrennial Design Competition, the most recent being in 2003. A commissioned Bravo Fact Film, *Mary Kerr: The Creative Process*, has been shown at the Museum of Modern Art in NYC. Mary has designed feature films, video and CBC television series. The acclaimed PBS series *The Toy Castle* for which Mary is the production designer won the recent 2003 Gemini Award for Best Children's Show. Credits at the Phoenix include costume designs for *Frogs, Endgame* and *Peer Gynt* and production design for *Hamlet, Maupassant* and *The Resistible Rise of Arturo Ui*. Mary is a Professor of Design at the University of Victoria and a member of the Directors Guild of Canada.



Randy Poulis Lighting Designer

Randy is in his second year of the MFA Theatre Design program. Last season he was lighting assistant on *The Imaginary Invalid* and *The Resistable Rise of Arturo Ui* and completed his first mainstage lighting design with *Circus Fire*. Following the challenges of *HE Who Gets Slapped*, Randy will be designing the lighting plot for two FIND Festival productions in the spring, one of which will become his MFA thesis production.



John Mills-Cockell Composer/Sound Designer

John Mills-Cockell has created over 100 scores for film, television and radio and has a discography of 10 recordings. Credits include sound design for *King Lear* produced by John Juliani for CBC Radio as well as productions for the National Arts Centre, Vancouver Playhouse, Richmond's Gateway Theatre, The Royal Winnipeg Ballet and The National Ballet of Canada. For the Phoenix, he designed the sound for last month's *The Taming of the Shrew* as well as *Peer Gynt*. John won the SOCAN award for outstanding contribution to


Canadian film and the Canadian Film and Television Award for best original score for *The Newcomers*. Recently, John was commissioned by Monart Pon to compose *Concerto of Deliverance* which will premiere this winter in Calgary.



Yasmine Kandil Assistant Director

Yasmine graduated from the American University in Cairo with a Bachelor of Arts degree specializing in theatre directing. Since then Yasmine has been working with independent theatre troupes as assistant director, actress and lighting designer. She formed an independent theatre troupe with fellow theatre practitioners and trained on various improvisational techniques through a system devised by French director Jean Michelle Bruyer. She has traveled to many European and Arab countries as the lighting designer for dance companies participating in various dance festivals. Her most

recent project was teaching drama to street children and youth garbage collectors in Cairo as part of a non-formal education project funded by UNESCO. Presently she is in her preparatory year for her MFA degree in theatre directing.





Paulette Hallich Clown Work

Paulette Hallich is an award-winning director, playwright, musician, visual artist and teacher. She has just moved to Victoria after 10 years teaching in theatre and classical animation in various colleges and universities in Toronto. Paulette co-founded Theatre Beyond Words in 1978 and toured internationally with the company, for which she performed, wrote and was Business Manager and Musical Director. Three of Paulette's own plays have been professionally produced. As well, she has worked with the National Arts Centre, Carousel



Michael Kennard Clown Work

Michael Kennard is best known as performer and co-creator, along with John Turner, of the Canadian clown duo *Mump & Smoot*. Their shows have enjoyed great success in the Fringe Festivals as well as at the Yale Repertory Theatre, the American Repertory Theatre in Cambridge, Massachusetts, La Jolla Playhouse, Dallas Theatre Centre, Off-Broadywasy in N.Y. and most recently at The Canadian Stage Berkley St. in Toronto. For the past six years Michael has been teaching in Toronto at The SPACE- Studio for Physical and Clown Exploration. Prior to that he taught at Equity Showcase in Toronto for seven years.

Michael and John have also taught at the University of Tel Aviv, Bishops University, California State University and the Yale School of Drama in the graduate program where they are associate artists.



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Julianne Moss Stage Manager

A theatre major in her third year, Julie is thrilled to be stage managing her first show for the Phoenix Theatre. She has worked with the Victoria Theatre Guild, Nickolodeon Players, Theatre Inconnu, Masques Theatre Co., and the Victoria Operatic Society to name a few. Past favorites include VOS's Sweeney Todd, Langham Court's The Lion in Winter and UVic's Peer Gynt.



K. Scott Malcolm Guest Faculty Artist

Scott has been a theatre professional since 1987 when he graduated from L'école internationale de Mimodrame de Marcel Marceau in Paris. He has worked extensively in Europe and around the world. 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
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
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




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
