

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Director's Notes



Originally set in London in the 1770's, Richard Brinsley Sheridan's wonderful comedy – replete with devilish wit, razor-sharp dialogue and outrageous situations – continues to delight audiences today. I thought it would be entertaining to see the play set in the present. In trying to find a modern parallel to the London of the 1700's, where scandal reigned supreme, I immediately thought of Los Angles, California.

In Sheridan's London, idle members of the upper class woke each morning to devour articles in the more than 20

newspapers delivered before breakfast. They delighted in scandalous tales of their acquaintances. Knowledge was power and gossip spread like wild fire. Is today so different? We not only have *People Magazine* and *The National Enquirer* we have *eTalk Daily, Survivor* and *Big Brother*. We are fascinated by the lives of today's genuine celebrities and those we have raised to the level of celebrity. We have become a nation of voyeurs. We tune in to get the latest update on Paris Hilton, Britney Spears, Brad and Angelina. We love nothing more than when celebrities end up destroying themselves

One of Sheridan's aptly named character's, Mrs. Sneerwell tells us, "there is no possibility of being witty without a little ill nature." We know what it is to spend gleeful evenings dishing our friends and the funnier we are in our ridicule the more popular we become. We like to laugh and often it is at others' expense. We may recognize ourselves in Sheridan's lampooning gossips.

The heart of the play involves a May/December marriage between Dr. Peter Teazle, an author, and his young wife from the country. They argue over Mrs. Teazle's extravagant spending and her involvement with Mrs. Sneerwell and the gossips. Dr. Peter suspects that his wife may be romantically linked to Charles Surface, a young nephew of his dear friend Oliver Surface. Dr. Peter loves his wife but can their marriage survive in the artificial society of Los Angles, the most artificial of cities?

I hope you enjoy the antics of Sheridan's lively gossipmongers and suffer along with Dr. Peter's pangs of jealousy. I also hope you will leave the theatre thinking about what pain the vicious tongue of slander can inflict. Are we better than Sheridan's characters or do we fall into the same traps, the same patterns of behavior and cause the same hurt as Sheridan's wonderful and comic creations?

Fran Gebhard Director

Fran teaches first year acting for the theatre department and received her MFA in Directing at the University of British Columbia. She has worked in theatres across Canada. Favourite acting credits include Lady Wishfort in *Way of the World*, Lycus in *A Funny Thing Happened On The Way To The Forum*, Brutus in *Julius Caesar*, and Mary in *Kilt*. She does regular performances of her one-woman show *Looking For Kitty*. She also appeared on the Phoenix stage as Martha in *Amigos Blue Guitar*. Fran directed *As You Like It* for the Canadian College

of the Performing Arts in October and *Crackpot* for the Phoenix a year ago. Other directing credits include *Twelfth Night, The Shadow Box, The Affections of May, A Midsummer Night's Dream, For The Pleasure of Seeing Her Again, and Les Liaisons Dangereuses.*

Film and television credits include *Blue City Slammers* (for which she received a Genie nomination), *The Chris Isaak Show, Just Deal, Ernest Goes to School, Shame, Police Academy, Common Ground* and *Moment of Truth*, Stephen Kings' *Dead Zone, Taken* and the soon to be released *Case No. 39* with Renee Zellweger. Fran was a series regular on *A Nice Show* for CBC.





Nathan Brown & Brian Culp Set Designers

This is Nathan Brown's first set design for a main stage production at the Phoenix, and he is pleased to be codesigning with Brian. Other work at UVIC includes the lighting designs for *Lionel: The Miracle Man, The Ugly Duchess*, and SATCo's *Grimm Tales, The Sex Lives of Vegetables*, and *Never Swim Alone*. Nathan is currently in his third year at the University of Victoria, working on a BFA in Theatre Design.

This is Brian Culp's design debut, a collaboration on behalf of his colleague Mr. Brown and himself. Brian demonstrates a wide variety of his talents in this show: designer, carpenter, painter... and a little acting. This couldn't have been done without the support of the faculty and his peers in the Phoenix.



Kate Costin Costume Designer

This is Kate's final semester and production at the Phoenix. In the department Kate has worked on *Wind in the Willows* (Stage Manager), *Street of Crocodiles* (Stage Manager), *Richard III* (Assistant Costume Designer), *Tyrants* (Assistant Stage Manager), *Crackpot* (dresser), and *Guys and Dolls* (crew). Previous credits include Out of Box's *Prior Engagement* (Stage Manager), Level Headed Friend's 2007 Toronto Fringe Festival production of *Dead Celebrities* (Stage Manager and Costume Designer), *Chip Pop: A Musical Sexploitation* (Costume

Designer), *Bent* (Costume Designer) and *High Life* (Costume Designer). Next year Kate will be attending Parson's School of Design in New York City.



Tim Herron Lighting Designer

This is Tim's sixth lighting design for a main-stage production at the Phoenix. His past Phoenix projects include *The Street of Crocodiles*, *Richard III*, *Top Girls*, *Accidental Death of an Anarchist* and *Fen*. Tim is the Technical Director and an instructor at Malaspina University College. His latest lighting designs include *Good Night Desdemona* at Malaspina, *Esmeralda* for Canadian Pacific Ballet and *Cabaret* and *Waiting for the Parade* for The Showcase Festival (Campbell/ Courtenay). Tim recently won the Victoria Critics Choice Award for his lighting design of *Richard III*.

With the advent of new technologies, sound for theatre has become a "new frontier" in theatre production. Members of the 205 Production course in the Sound Specialty LAB, learn about the application and operation of new and old audio technologies. They also undertake individual practical projects where they work with a Sound Designer on a Phoenix production and perform as Audio Console Operator for the run of that show. With *The School for Scandal*, however, they have taken on as a team the design component itself, which has provided them with a whole new viewpoint on, and appreciation for, the process of creating sound for theatre.



Virginia W. Lo Stage Manager

Born and raised in Hong Kong, flying across the Pacific to study theatre was the riskiest decision Virginia has ever made and so far the best one. Previous Phoenix credits include *Studio Series 2006* and *Richard III* (Assistant Stage Manager), *Studio Series 2007* (Producer/Stage Manager) and *Wind in the Willows* (Assistant to Costume Designer). The past summer, she also worked as an ASM for the Dance Training Program at The Banff Centre. Robb Wiggin Pool Boy


