

## Director's Notes



The period between 1940-45 (when tonight's play was first created and produced) was one of the darkest times in both modern American and world history. In the space of five long years, the world would witness the aftermath of the Great Depression, the atrocities of the Nazi Death camps and the annihilation of whole cities with the dropping of the bombs on Hiroshima and Nagasaki. Hatred abounded and was particularly virulent if you happened to be born into one of several identified 'enemy' cultures. Nietzsche's half-century old proclamation that

"God is Dead" seemed for many to be both prescient and horrifying. What else but a godless universe could give rise to such an outpouring of evil being inflicted by man upon man?

In this climate, Howard Richardson and William Berney decided to doggedly pursue the production of their play about a witch who fell in love with a human. On the surface it paints a portrait of a North Carolina community that is locked in the centuries old war between Christianity and paganism. However, if one takes the central metaphor of the title to refer to an eclipse of the lunar surface and, if we further trace this word back to the Greek's sense that this constituted an act of abandonment by their gods, I think we get closer to the intent of this fascinating and ambiguous story.

Despite its simple use of narrative, there are no easy answers in tonight's *Dark of the Moon*. Perhaps this is why it has continued to fascinate audiences in the sixty plus years since it first appeared?

His productions of *Fire* and *Lilies* won Toronto's Dora Mavor Moore Awards for Outstanding Production and his 2004 Belfry production of *Proof* won the Victoria Spotlight Award as Best Production. He is also a winner and four-time nominee for Outstanding Director in the Dora Awards. He was founding Artistic Director of Saskatoon's Persephone Theatre and served as Artistic Director for Montreal's Playwrights Workshop, Thunder Bay's Magnus

Theatre and Toronto's Theatre Passe Muraille. Brian's most recent professional directing credits include *Lagrimas Crueles* at the Teatro Salvador Novo del Centro Nacional de las Artes in Mexico City, *Honour* for the Belfry Theatre and Winnipeg's Prairie Theatre Exchange and *Old Times* for the Neptune Theatre in Halifax. For the Phoenix, Brian has directed *Frogs, Peer Gynt, The Resistible Rise of Arturo Ui, He Who Gets Slapped, The Fever, Guys and Dolls, Tyrants* and *Wind In The Willows*. Brian is also the Founder and Producing Artistic Director of Victoria's newest professional Theatre, Blue Bridge Repertory Theatre.



## John Mills-Cockell Music Director & Sound Design

John has created over 100 scores for film, TV and radio and has a discography of 10 recordings. Credits include scores for King Lear produced by John Juliani for CBC Radio and the CBC TV series 49th & Main as well as productions for Canadian Stage, National Arts Centre, Vancouver Playhouse, The Royal Winnipeg Ballet, and The National Ballet of Canada. For the Phoenix he has designed sound for The Taming of the Shrew, He Who Gets Slapped, Peer Gynt, Tyrants and Wind in the Willows. John won the SOCAN Award for outstanding contribution to Canadian Film and the

Canadian Film & Television Award for best original score for *The Newcomers*. He received a Canada Council grant for the composition of his music/theatre piece *Savitri & Sam* that is now being workshopped in Toronto.

### Conrad Alexandrowicz & Ingrid Hansen\* Movement & Choreography



#### Nathan Brown Stage Manager



## In Memoriam: Michael W. Meloche (1945-2008)

Michael was a familiar figure at the Phoenix for many years, as an undergraduate (BFA'93) and then graduate design student (MFA'98), as a Set Designer, Props builder, Scenic and Props Assistant, and Acting Props Coordinator. As a professional set and props designer and builder in the community, he worked on the 1994 Commonwealth Games Opening and Closing Ceremonies, on television commercials and feature films, at the Banff Centre for the Arts Festival of the Arts, on various productions for Pacific Opera Victoria, the Conservatory of Music, and the international premiere of On This Planet. He designed and created a two-story, relief wall sculpture for the Westshore Child, Youth and Family Centre.

Michael was also an advocate for people living with severe disabilities in the community, initiating supported employment programs and job coaching with the Victoria Vocational College. He believed strongly in nurturing the talents of everyone in a community.

Michael was a gifted artist who was passionate about teaching and theatre. He loved all of theatre, from its history, theories and philosophies, to its various manifestations from the script to the stage. He was a good friend and supportive colleague, a patient teacher, and a nurturing mentor to all those who encountered him. He will be greatly missed.




