DIRECTOR Fran Gebhard



Fran is an Assistant Teaching Professor in the Theatre Department at the University of Victoria, where she teaches Acting for the Stage as well as Acting for the Camera. She enjoys directing both classic plays and works by Canadian playwrights, with favourites including You're a Good Man, Charlie Brown, The School for Scandal, Wreckage, As You Like It, For the Pleasure of Seeing Her Again, Salt-Water Moon, A Midsummer Night's Dream, and Les Liaisons Dangereuses.

More recently, Fran directed *Dead Man's Cell Phone* for the Phoenix Theatre at UVic and *Heirlooms and Baggage* for Delta Stage Works. She has acted in stages across Canada and has appeared in several films and TV productions. She was nominated for a Genie Award for her role in *Blue City Slammers*.

Canadian plays have long been Fran's focus. She was the program head of the Banff Playwrights' Colony for many years and has worked as an adjudicator for Theatre BC, frequently leading acting and directing workshops for TBC at Mainstage. She has also served as a dramaturge/director for the New Play Festival on several occasions. Fran says she loves sharing her passion for the theatre with the students and that working at UVic is a privilege.

DIRECTOR notes

Twelfth Night is one of Shakespeare's most beloved comedies, and for good reason. Its themes of love and desire, madness and melancholy, and gender and identity remain as relevant today as ever. We felt it was a perfect choice for both our student body and our audiences.

I set the play in late summer 2037 on Vancouver Island's West Coast, where climate-related catastrophes—wildfires, extreme rainfall, hurricanes, flooding and earthquakes—have impacted the region. Olivia's father and brother have perished in these disasters, and the characters we meet are rebuilding their lives in Illyria, where their summer homes once stood.

I am so grateful to have worked with such an inventive and adaptable cast and crew of students and staff! Our talented students have designed an engaging environment, striking costumes, evocative lighting and sound. We even have a student musician who composed some of the music. Of course, the students are supported by our tremendous staff and faculty. My thanks to all of them, it has been a privilege to work together.

We have had such fun realizing our production of Shakespeare's timeless play! My only hope is that your enjoyment exceeds ours!
