This project is a collaboration between the UVic Departments of Theatre, Psychology, Curriculum & Instruction, Educational Psychology and Leadership Studies, the Inter-Cultural Association of Greater Victoria, and the Vancouver Island Counselling Centre for Immigrants and Refugees.

### **Project Description**

This project is comprised of many team members who have come together to test the effectiveness of a method of practice developed by Yasmine, called "Celebratory Theatre". The team hopes to test the ways in which this method creates social cohesion and belonging for newcomer immigrants and refugees.

Yasmine and her assistants delivered celebratory theatre workshops for a group of newcomers over a period of two months in 2024. Based on the stories and experiences shared in these workshops, Yasmine, with the participation of the original ensemble, devised this show to showcase the courage, strength and resilience of these participants through these five interwoven narratives. The theme of birds runs throughout as poems are narrated and staged, drawing parallels between the migratory journey of birds and our newcomer immigrants and refugees.
